ACADEMIC FOUNDATION

St. Michael's School offers a rigorous academic curriculum designed to prepare our students to succeed at the most competitive universities in the world.

The **21st Century Skills** prepare students for success in learning, work, citizenship, and life.

Singapore Math emphasizes the development of strong number sense, excellent mental math skills, and a deep understanding of place value.

Project Based Learning is a teaching method in which students gain knowledge and skills by investigating and responding to an authentic, engaging, and complex question, problem, or challenge.

The **Common Core** standards are a set of high-quality academic standards created to ensure that all students graduate from high school with the skills and knowledge necessary to succeed in college, career, and life.

Advanced Placement courses are rigorous, college-level classes in a variety of subjects that give students an opportunity to acquire college credits.

AP Capstone gives students a pedagogical foundation, called the QUEST framework, to develop, practice, and hone their critical and creative thinking skills as they make connections between various issues and their own lives.

SUPA is one of the leading concurrent enrollment programs. Students who succeed have the opportunity to earn college credits, which can result in savings for college through the significantly reduced tuition rate.

Our STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) and innovation classes aim to foster creativity, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills by integrating diverse disciplines. These classes encourage students to explore real-world challenges, think collaboratively, and develop innovative solutions using a blend of scientific inquiry, technological tools, artistic expression, and engineering principles. The goal is to prepare students for future careers in a rapidly evolving world, equipping them with the knowledge and adaptability needed to thrive in both academic and professional environments.

Our main instruction is delivered in English, but we also fully comply with all MINERD requirements for **Lengua Española** and **Sociales**, as well as the French Ministry of Education standards for our **French classes**.

Ranging from fine arts to science, literature to sports, electives may spark a new passion or inspire a career path.





CHARACTER EDUCATION

Civic literacy promotes exercising the rights and obligations of citizenship at local, state, national, and global levels, and understanding the local and global implications of civic decisions.


